It has pretty much remained untouched and still stands as a testament to the past glories of holidaying in Norfolk and the realities of capitalism's effect on rural areas. It would be amazing to see parts of this reanimated by artists and the local community.
The Chapel of St Peter-On-The-Wall	Bradwell-on-Sea, United Kingdom	CM0 7PN	"We've nominated one of the oldest intact Christian churches in England. It is the 19th oldest building in the country, dating back to around AD 660-662. Today it is located next to Christian commune, the Othona community. Structurally, the nave remains, with foundations of an apse and flanking chapels. Until 1920 the chapel was used as a barn, but it was then restored and re-consecrated. It is now Grade I listed. It is largely composed of re-used Roman stone, and the remaining building is distinctive for the height of its walls."
Tesco site	Chatteris, United Kingdom	PE16 6TG	Tesco decided not to open this store in Chatteris after it had nearly finished being built in 2016. The plot lays empty and unused just off the main street in the village, but is a fantastic scope and size to be brought back to life.
Petrified Forest Mundon	Mundon, United Kingdom	CM9 6PA	The rural landscape of the East of England is one of expansive skies and flat plains. The horizon feels like a definite line and out of it, near the village of Mundon, loom these incredible trees that look like they have been inverted; with the roots where the branches and leaves should be. It's a disconcerting sight. Very sculptural but also very melancholic especially on a summers day when the fact that they are long-dead seems even more striking. This forest of great oaks have become frozen; in their location and in time.
Cherry Hinton Chalk Pits	Fulbourn Rd, Cambridge, United Kingdom	CB1 9JL	Owned by the Wildlife Trust and now a local geological site, this chalk pit was worked up until the 1980s. It provided much of the stonework for buildings around Cambridge since the 1400s and still provides spring water to the area today. "These chalk pits blew my mind when I first visited them. They are located just outside the city centre yet so few people know about them. The barren, bleached landscape is wonderful for exploring and seems a world away from the Cambridge we associate with punting and Kings College Chapel."
Concrete Pyramid	55 S Beach Parade, Great Yarmouth NR30 3JP, UK	NR30 3PX	"This is an amazing site that feels like it's at the edge of the world. The concrete pyramid is situated close to massive maritime endeavours and signifiers of power - Great Yarmouth's outer harbour and the offshore wind farm that it serves, as well as Nelson's Monument. It was something to do with the former coal power station that stood nearby but now it stands in the sea as a brutalist concrete sculpture for cormorants to dry their wings and brave swimmers to venture out to."

Fiscal Policy wood	Lover's Lane, Leiston, Suffolk, United Kingdom	IP16	"Bizarrely named piece of forgotten woodland near proposed Sizewell C Nuclear Power Station. OS have been unable to determine when it was named. It feels as if this location must have some strange deep significance"
The Art Station	Railway Station, Saxmundham, United Kingdom	IP17 1BW	"New and exciting place to exhibit and discuss art in all its genres"

Cherry Hinton Chalk Pits	Fulbourn Road, Cambridge, United Kingdom	CB1 9JL	"This is a magical place for my children because their childminder lives nearby and they regularly visit the chalk pits as part of their morning walks. For them it is sometimes the surface of the moon, at other times a beach, or a wild prairie. They regularly return home with their pockets full of chalk, which they then use to draw pictures on our patio, later to be washed away by the rain. The first time we visited as a family, it was the children who showed us round and led us there. It is a hidden away, strange and intriguing place, and very special to us."

Sogenhoe Anglo-Saxon Chapel	Ufford, United Kingdom	IP13	"Little known but fascinating, The site of Sogenhoe Chapel features a wooden cross in a copse and an interpretation board. Given it's close proximity to Sutton Hoo and Rendlesham (the site of Raedwald's hall), I have always liked to think it's significance was once great and that Ufford, named for the mythic King Uffa, was a site of great meaning for the Anglo-Saxons. It should be better known, not least to protect it from future and proposed developments nearby."
Norwich Road Ipswich	Ipswich, United Kingdom	IP1 2PT	"The upper end of the road is ripe for artists and creative regeneration. Strong international communities, a variety of cultural offers in town."
St Clement Church (a.k.a Ipswich Arts Centre)	Ipswich Arts Centre, Fore St, Ipswich, United Kingdom	IP4 1JZ	"St. Clement Church is one of three medieval flint churches close to the Ipswich Waterfront development, and the last to find a long term re-use. Of the three churches it undoubtedly has the finest setting with a generous graveyard and a number of mature trees. The church is largely C15th and has an exterior of flint with stone quoins. It has a grand tower, perpendicular windows, a clerestory and an 1860's chancel. The church was dedicated to the patron saint of sailormen and has from the beginning had strong connections with the seafaring community. The anchor emblem of the saint can be seen carved in stone details around the church. St. Clement was deconsecrated in the 1970's and used briefly as storage of the Wolsey Theatre Group. Following a fire in the 1980's the church underwent significant restoration works. The church is currently being brought back into the cultural and social life of the community it was built to serve, as Ipswich's Arts Centre."
Canvey Wick	Northwick Road, Canvey Island, United Kingdom	SS8 0PT	This strange and wonderful sci-fi landscape is described as a little brownfield rainforest by Natural England officer Dr Chris Gibson, the results of surveys have shown Canvey Wick to have more biodiversity per square foot than any other site in the UK•This nature reserve was designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) on 11 February 2005 the first brownfield site to be protected specifically for its invertebrates.'
The ruins of St Mary's Church and the Witches Wooden Leg	Back Road, Somerton, Great Yarmouth, United Kingdom	NR29	"This is a quiet hidden place of magic, elusive and hard to find, after visiting I have since lost all photos of my journey. Only the walls of the church remain, with a huge oak in its centre bursting through what would be the roof. This is the result of a curse from the local witch, the tree growing from her wooden leg. It's a place where I think it's possible to reconnect with the histories of witchcraft so prevalent in East Anglia."
Wellington Pier Roller Rink	Marine Parade, Great Yarmouth, United Kingdom	NR30 3JF	"It's practical and poetic. Fond memories of gliding around this as a child. Nature is slowly reclaiming the surface and space which is currently inaccessible but feels like it could be activated in new ways."
Wisbech Castle	Museum Square, Wisbech, United Kingdom	PE13 1ES	"Fantastic history, beautiful building, stunning location, so much of interest, yet easily passed by"
Boon's Heath	The Shrublands, Burgh Saint Peter, United Kingdom	NR34 0BB	"A former quarry restored to heathland and woodland, with panoramic view over the Waveney valley, footpath access, picnic benches. Has visitor centre and public conveniences, educational facilities, all managed by Suffolk Wildlife trust. End of Icknield Way and start of Peddar's Way trails. See http://www.suffolkwildlifetrust.org/knettishallheath/ "

Five Finger Point	Blythburgh, United Kingdom	IP19 9NF	"The postcode leads to a house off the road next to the junction, which is almost halfway towards Westleton from Blythburgh. There are 4 exits visible on the map, but there is also a track leading to a car park, making it, as we knew it, Five Finger Point. The car park is easily visible from the road and would make an interesting space for a public project. The crossroads are regularly used by people visiting the area for local walks on the heath, and when driving or cycling towards Westleton, Dunwich and RSPB Minsmere from the A12."

Broomway	Foulness Island, United Kingdom		"I walked the Broomway last year and still I can't quite believe it wasn't a dream. Known as Britain's most treacherous path because of the rapid tides, the route takes you from mainland Essex to the MoD controlled island of Foulness. The four-hour journey is like navigating the surface of another planet; walking on silver water, into a hazy, far-off horizon. This is Essex at its best: strange, beautiful and potentially lethal."

SaltHouse Marshes	Salthouse, North Norfolk District, United Kingdom	NR25 7SA	"There are a multitude of spooky, magical, marshy, pools which belong in a Studio Ghibli film. They are haunting and beautiful and in the right light are silver and purple. There are birds.... so many birds...."
The Witches Heart of Kings Lynn	Tuesday Market Place, King's Lynn, United Kingdom	PE30 1EZ	"The Tuesday Marketplace in King's Lynn (the town's central market area now a rather large cobblestone car park bordered by the Corn Exchange and a variety of pubs and hotels) was, for many years, the scene of the public execution of 'witches'. Having been accused (and found guilty) of witchcraft, Margaret Read was burned alive in Lynn's Tuesday Marketplace in 1590. The legend (of which there are several versions) states that, whilst she was being consumed by the flames, Margaret's heart spontaneously burst from her body and hit the wall of a house opposite searing a permanent sign into the brickwork that can still be seen to this day. The heart is then said to have quite consciously bounced all the way out of town and into the River Ouse where it disappeared beneath the surface of the water in angry, sulphurous waves that recalled the bubbling of a cauldron. The Lynn 'witch's heart' (also known as the Diamond Heart) can be seen high up on the brickwork of House No 15/16 on the north side of Tuesday Marketplace."
Warham Camp/ Hill Fort	Warham, North Norfolk District, United Kingdom		"Its STUNNING. The fort is bigger than you think, and more magical. Its near the River Stiffkey, south of the village of Warham. Warham Camp is circular, has a diameter of 212 metres with a 3-metre-high double bank and ditch. It dates to the last few centuries before the Roman invasion of Britain, with evidence of post-occupation activity. The University of East Anglia has described it as the best-preserved hill fort in Norfolk."
Martello Tower	Aldeburgh, Suffolk IP15 5NA, United Kingdom	IP15 5NA	"It was built to keep Napoleon out between 1808 and 1812 and is incredibly unique; it is one of the only remaining towers."
Pitstone Windmill	Pitstone, Leighton Buzzard, United Kingdom	LU7 9ER	"It is one of the earliest forms of windmill still standing today and is a national, industrial treasure."
Tring Reservoir	Tring Rural, Tring HP23 4LH, United Kingdom	HP23 4LH	"The reservoirs are beautiful and serene."
Corner of Cavendish Way/ Comet Way	Cavendish Way, Hatfield, United Kingdom	AL9 9RH	A neglected corner overlooking the, soon to disappear, iconic Comet Hotel and busy Comet Roundabout. A major road sign has not been replaced after a major storm 3 years ago and presents an opportunity to enhance this busy corner (and perhaps mark Hatfields aviation heritage
St Peter's Chapel on the Wall	Bradwell-on-Sea, United Kingdom	CM0 7PN	"It's so spiritual...I want to see that spirit reflected in art"
Royston Cave	Royston Cave, Melbourn Street, Royston, United Kingdom	SG8 7BZ	"Unique cave carvings. Amazing hidden heritage."
The Black Tower, Norwich	Carrow Hill, Norwich, United Kingdom	NR1 2AJ	"The Black Tower is tucked away and overlooked. It's a beautiful part of the wall that used to surround Norwich. Plants are growing on it, over it and inside the tower itself. I have lived here all my life and found out that it existed and where it was located only this year (I am 47). It's part of our history and is being left to deteriorate. It could be included on walks and promoted to tourists. It is such a shame to see it being neglected."
Mill Road Cemetery	Cambridge, United Kingdom	CB12AW	"Established in 1848, the cemetery has graves from a number of Cambridge parishes. There gravestones of famous academics and tiny children, broken statuary, half-sunken slabs and border stones. But the place is very much alive. It's the biggest green space in a congested area. It allows disaffected teens to smoke surreptitiously and toddlers to smash their way through puddles and old people to walk dogs and homeless people to hang out in a non-threatening place and everyone to pick blackberries, cherries, elderflower, etc, for home cooking. According to wikipedia, the cemetery is also listed as a City Wildlife Site, containing many indicator plant species for undisturbed neutral/calcareous grassland amongst the 110+ species identified. At least 35 species of bird, 23 species of butterflies and several species of mammal have also been reported, including the European dormouse and weasel."

Peter Scott Walk	The Wash, Norfolk	PE12 9YT	"It's beautiful and empty"
Saffron Walden Town Library	2 King St, Saffron Walden, Essex, United Kingdom	CB10 1ES	"Founded in 1832 as the Saffron Walden Literary & Scientific Institution, this is a hidden gem bursting with a surprisingly varied collection of books dating from the 14th century onwards. An airy Victorian reading room is surrounded by shelves loaded with local history, reference and numerous volumes donated by the Gibson family, the local bankers and philanthropists, who supported the library in its early days. The collection of more than 25,000 books demonstrates the wide-ranging interests of the nineteenth century founders and later librarians. Natural history, literature, art and bibliography are all well represented but there is a smattering of virtually every subject including several scrapbooks of ephemera from the Great Exhibition and some wonderful examples of early photographic illustration. New works are added regularly to the core collection and a broad selection of academic journals can be found on open display. Here is a chance to take time out from the bustle of the 21st century and to delve into one of the best public collections of books in Essex."

This is both romantic and terrifying, as we conjure up in our minds the crumbled remnants of lost lives sitting on the sea bed, hidden from sight, but perhaps remembered (or imagined) by those left behind."

Martello Tower, Jaywick Sands	Belsize Avenue, Jaywick, United Kingdom	CO15 2LF	"A real pleasure to visit and the staff re very keen to get people involved, whether local or holiday makers"
St Ives (Nr Huntingdon)	Saint Ives, Cambridgeshire, United Kingdom	PE27 5BX	"In 1899 the nearby town of Huntingdon adandoned their plan to erect a statue of Oliver Cromwell, and the opportunity was seized by St Ives" The poor relation to Cambridge St Ives has a great location but is in dire need of a cultural uplift."
Beacon Hill Fort	Harwich, United Kingdom	CO12 3NS	"Because is it a site of historical importance and is currently almost inaccessible to the public because of the surrounding fencing on the promenade, and over-grown flora and fauna. Currently this is considered to be a blot on the landscape but could be a park with history!"

Wells Maltings Project	Wells Maltings Project, Staithe Street, Wells-next-the-Sea, Norfolk, United Kingdom	NR23 1AU	"An exciting project space for community, art and heritage. Currently being revived and restored. Set in the heart of the thriving community of Wells-next-the-sea. Would be great to see some innovative and inspiring contemporary art here."
Panacea Museum	9 Newnham Road, Bedford, United Kingdom	MK40 3NX	This is a fascinating museum that tells the story of a religious movement that started in Bedford in the early 20th century and which had a worldwide reach. Mabel "Octavia" Baltrop was heralded as the Shiloh or second coming of the Messiah and was seen as the eighth in a line of prophets reaching back to Joanna Southcott in the 18th Century. The building is the place where it was hoped that 24 bishops and attendant others would gather to open Joanna Southcott's box of prophecies at a time of national crisis. The box remains unopened. A lovely building which charts the rise of the Panacea movement and the prophets that came before including letters from people around the world who wrote in for the panacea, a small piece of cloth over which Mabel had breathed, which was said to cure all ills. Entry is completely free, there is a small cafe in the communal garden which was seen as the garden of Eden. The place has a very peaceful atmosphere. No followers are still living but the community, which owned many houses in Bedford, left the property in trust.
St Andrew's Church	Lamas, Norfolk, United Kingdom	NR10 5JQ	"The church and the surroundings evoke the character of the Bure Valley."
Coprolite Street	Coprolite Street, Ipswich, United Kingdom	IP3 0BN	"Coprolite is Fossilised Dinosaur Poo! Coprolite Street was once the site of Fison one of the worlds first manufacturers of fertilizers - super phosphate - made from the ground up nodules of coprolite. A whole coprolite mining industry sprung up across the region during the 19th century. Shillington in Bedfordshire was actually called shittington... i will see if I can get that on the map too"

Despite the closeness to the high street, this unique combination of natural and historic built assets have been hidden for decades. Yet they hold special memories for the many people who worked at the local factory, or who played in this woods and shelters as children. A growing number of residents believe it is time for these assets to be seen, and their significance recognised and cherished for generations to come."

The chapel was abandoned in 1539 after the dissolution of nearby St Leonards Priory. In 1549 Robert Kett set up his headquarters here during the Norfolk rebellion when he besieged the City and housed his prisoners in the adjacent St Leonards Priory. During the late Victorian era, walks and flights of steps were laid out around the romantic chapel ruins and it became a fashionable place to visit. The site was owned and cared for by the nearby gasworks, but during the Second World War the garden was turned into allotments before becoming derelict. The Friends of Ketts Heights was set up in November 2015 to support the regeneration of Ketts Heights so that it can be a welcoming space for the local community and visitors to Norwich; an attractive space with a wide diversity of plants and wildlife; an event space with activities to suit a wide audience, and an educational space where its long and diverse history can be investigated and interpreted.

Stories of houses being built up against the wall (with evidence of plumbing still embedded), to children scrabbling through its drains in olden days. Thoughts and themes it inspires include BORDERS, PROTECTION, DIVISION, and my favourite COLONISATION (the Romans who built the wall but also the fauna and flora which has invaded and colonised the wall over the years).

They were shipped in all the way from Norway, and you can see lines and holes on some of them, made by the dynamite rods they use to blast them in the quarry. It made me think about MIGRATION and BELONGING, and what's on the beach that comes from somewhere else. It made me think of the migratory population of Jaywick itself, a community made up of people who come from other parts of the UK, mainly from the East End of London. Nominated by local historian Norman Jacobs, he gave a fascinating talk in situ about the building and its history. It is now a restaurant, bowling alley and amusements arcade combined, and the owner very generously let us take over half the restaurant for Norman's talk, with free tea and coffee. It was great to see Norman peel away the layers of history, like we were in a time machine travelling back 100 years, standing in the same place and watching it change before us. He presented research and old photographs, telling its story from open band stand on the sea front drawing crowds of hundreds, to a 3000 seated theatre hosting big names. The building fell into decline in the 80s and 90s, but has recently been painstakingly renovated by Clacton entrepreneur Billy Peake, who is passionate about the regeneration of the area. It's not often you get to see the context of a building in such detail, in situ. Really interesting as a landmark to Clacton's rise, fall and rise again.

One chapter is dedicated to the search for the lost Roman Road in his home village of Little Maplestead, so he led us on a walking tour to find this ancient relic. It felt rather timeless, a bit surreal and out of time, standing on a hilltop with a large group of people and contemplating a lost road's route through the countryside. The highlight was moving onto some farm buildings and standing in the middle of quite a busy road. This was where the Roman road would have intersected with the new one - a meeting point between the old and now non-existent, and the contemporary, very real world. Soldiers' Graffiti at the former Cavalry Barracks	Cavalry Road, Colchester, United Kingdom		I would like to nominate the walls of the former Colchester Cavalry Barracks Riding School, now a Doctors surgery based on a brand new housing estate. Hidden and largely unseen on the walls of this listed building can be seen soldiers graffiti scratched into the soft red brick some dated from over 150 years ago. War is often thought of as exciting, action packed and dangerous, but the soldiers graffiti speaks to me of hours of dull waiting, and the anxiety that being a soldier must entail. The exquisite Victorian script of a 4th Hussar, cheeky nicknames, and simple drawings of horseshoes, union jacks and Irish tricolour flags, remain unnoticed by hoards of people using the surgery, yet memorialise the lives of a host of bored ghost soldiers.
Kelvedon Hatch Secret Nuclear Bunker	Kelvedon Hall Lane, Kelvedon Hatch, United Kingdom	CM14 5TL	The worst kept secret in Essex. This huge underground bunker would have housed the Prime Minister and Government officials in the event of a nuclear war, along with 600 military personnel and civil servants. The land was requisitioned from a local farmer and the bunker built in 1952, and was fully operational for 40 years until 1992, after which it was bought back by the same family and opened as a museum. It is an amazing space lots of 60s - 80s kitsch which makes for an alternative ironic day out, yet absolutely frightening at the same time. There's a post-apocalyptic air to this disused military compound, with a lone child's see-saw, decommissioned missiles and even a tank on arrival. As well as being a museum with an awesomely retro self-guided audio tour, the venue is also host to scout sleepovers, a climbing wall, office away days, dummies adorned with Thatcher masks, and overnight paranormal tours. But I think it is important and timely to revisit this defunct space, with the threat of nuclear war becoming more real than ever since the 1980s.

Hingham is our smallest static public library (a former TA training hut) which sits on a small section at the edge of the village green and Wroxham is built on stilts, it also has a large outdoor space to the front of the building visible from the road (see pic).

Some students love the simplicity. In the 60's they were seen as radical and the height of community living, but now some would say they are "outdated high-rise hells". I heard they were used as a lookout towers during the cold war, situated in an ideal spot to see Russian bombers fly over from the North Sea to London - allegedly there are (or used to be) red telephones on the top of the towers, with a direct line to Whitehall to give a five minute warning of imminent nuclear attack.

Church of St. Peter & St. Paul (St Osyth)	Church Square, Saint Osyth, United Kingdom	CO16 8NX	"The village of St Osyth suffered at least two periods of persecution as witchcraft hysteria swept through East Anglia, one being in 1582 and the second being in 1645. Perhaps the most well-known 'witch' was a villager, Ursula Kemp, who was accused by various persons of using familiars to kill and bring sickness to her neighbours. Her examination took place before Brian Darcy, a magistrate and descendant of the Darcys who owned the local Priory. Kemp was eventually found guilty and hanged in Chelmsford in 1582. Later in 1645, despite the Civil War which was ranging at the time, came the second outbreak of witch-hunting, on a much larger scale, incorporating no less than twenty two women from the area. The culmination of four St Osyth witches being hanged at Chelmsford, namely Joyce Boanes, Susan Cock, Rebecca Jones and Margaret Landish. In addition, Rose Hallybread died in jail. Although many of these women confessed to evil doing in the hope of mercy, it was always to no avail. Given that a church has stood on the site of St Peter and St Paul's church in St Osyth for at least 900 years, and that it was undoubtedly where many of the persecuted women went to worship, it seems like an appropriate area to commemorate their lives. Moreover, given that Darcy's epitaph (which is housed within the church) contains no mention of his activities as a witch finder, it would be particularly fitting for a commemorative project to be featured here; especially one which informs the public of this dark period in history, and honours the lives of those who were the victims of ignorance and prejudice. Note: if the church ground is not appropriate, the green outside of the St Osyth priory would also be a suitable environment to house such a project."
