RATIONALE

- This risk assessment has been compiled to protect people from real harm and suffering through practical steps, in line with the UK's Health & Safety Executive (HSE)
- The event plan seeks to balance the unachievable aim of absolute safety, and the kind of poor management of risk that damages lives.
- The event seeks to give young people autonomy and responsibility to explore their own creative interests, in an environment where risks are managed as much as possible.
- Covid-19 note: the risk around covid-19 is factored on the current/anticipated situation, as of September 2024.
- It is the responsibility of the person booking (parent/guardian/youth worker/group leader) to ensure they understand and agree to the plans put in place to minimise potential risks during the event at Wysing and undertake their own assessment of risk for the young person/people they intend on bringing to the event.
- Wysing Arts Centre has made this information available to support group leaders, youth workers, parents/guardians to ensure the health and welfare of the young people they are booking places for. Wysing can provide assistance in helping group leaders, youth workers, parents/guardians to identify any additional risks posed by any young people they are intending on bringing to the event.
